THE WISDOM OF FULTON SHEEN

Imagine a large circle and in the center of it rays of
light that spread out to the circumference. The light
in the center is God; each of us is a ray, The closer
the rays are to the center, the closer the rays are to
one another,. The closer we live to God, the closer
we are bound to our neighbor; the farther we are
from God, the farther we are from one another. The
more each ray departs from its center, the weaker it
becomes; and the closer it gets to the center, the
stronger it becomes.
