SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FOR 2023-2024 SENIORS

There are two scholarships available through the Knights of Columbus.

The Knights of Columbus Council 2241 Scholarship and the Hamilton Scholarship.

To apply for the Knights of Columbus \$500 Scholarship, you must be a practicing Catholic attending St. Mary's Catholic Church or St. Patrick's Catholic Church and must be a senior at South Shelby or North Shelby High School. The scholarship must be used to attend a 1, 2 or 4 year university, college, or trade school and must demonstrate good moral character and possess a strong academic record based on scholarship and involvement in extracurricular activities.)

Applicants for the Charles and Pauline Hamilton Scholarship (\$2000.00 on an annual basis) must be a full-time student in an accredited 4-year university or college. Must demonstrate good moral character and possess a strong academic record based on scholarship and involvement in extracurricular activities The applicant must provide a report of academic performance every semester (unofficial transcript is acceptable). Please note, you will need to meet with Father Peckman so he can write a recommendation letter. For consideration of scholarship renewal, the scholarship recipient must have maintained a GPA of 3.00 on a 4.00 scale each semester.

The applications must to be turned in to Pat Greenwell by Thursday, February 1, 2024 Applications are available with guidance counselors at South Shelby & North Shelby or at the Parish Office.
